Setting the farm up to produce high quality silage this May.



On dairy calf to beef farms there is no place for poor quality silage. Animals must be performing every day that they are on farm. Silage in most cases will make up one quarter to one third of the animals annual diet and therefore all silage fed should be of a very high quality (>72% DMD). He puts a huge value on having two customers for calves that return year on year. Paul also discusses the value of good calf genetics can have on the whole process from calf birth to finish and further in the processors.
