



## Grass growth, rainfall & soil temperature predictions for the next 7 days

Grass growth predictions Next week (kg DM/ha/day)









- Grass growth for the coming week predicted to range between 6-10 kg DM/ha
- Heavy rainfall predicted for the south with up to 49mm and 20-25mm for the remaining parts of the country
- Soil temperatures will remain between 5-7 degrees

## **Weekly Checklist**



#### Can grazing begin on your farm?

- Grazing has begun on many farms with the settled conditions
- Start grazing in grass covers of 700-1000 kg DM/ha
- You should aim for at least one grazing per day currently
- Restrict access to silage after morning milking so cows have keen appetite to graze by 10am. With predicted weather forecast on/off grazing may be needed

 Allocate 6kg DM of grass by day to calved cows & increase allocation twice per week if clean outs are good

#### Attend a Spring Pasture Morning near you!

- The Teagasc KT & Grass10 team are running 30+ spring grazing events during February & March
- These events will focus on selecting paddocks for early grazing, early N & slurry application, feeding the cow better and successful feed budgeting
- Spring Pasture Mornings in full swing across the country with upcoming events this week and next week

#### Using your nutrients efficiently this Spring

- The closed period for chemical fertiliser has now passed
- If spreading fertiliser, apply 16-20 units/ac of a urea based product (preferable protected urea) on trafficable paddocks, that haven't received slurry
- Adhere to buffer zones, soil temperatures and rainfall warnings in advance of spreading fertiliser
- Spread slurry at a rate of max. 2000 gal/acre of dilute cattle slurry. Adhere to buffer zones and weather warnings
- Standard cattle slurry is worth €28 per 1,000 gallons so use it wisely

#### Complete your AFC & grass budget on PastureBase Ireland

- Need to establish grass supply for your farm
- Walk your farm and complete your opening AFC on PBI
- Initial covers are slightly behind target of 1000 kg DM/ha AFC (dairy farms)
- Complete a grass budget to map out your grazing and achieve targets

## Spring Grazing Allocations



#### Grass Demand in Early February

40 cows going to grass by day (1 allocation)
Allocating 6 kg DM grass per cow
40 cows x 6kg DM = 240 kg DM required

### Grazings/Paddock

Paddock 10 (1.2 Ha) with grass cover 1000 kg DM/Ha 1.2 Ha x 1000 kg DM/ha = 1200 kg DM available in paddock

1200 kg DM ÷ 240 kg DM = 5 grazing's

#### **Measuring Grass Allocation**

1 Ha = 100m x 100m 1.2 Ha ÷ 5 grazing's = 0.25 Ha per grazing 0.25 Ha = 2500 m2

Paddock 10 = 40m wide 2500m2 ÷ 40m = 62m long In paddock 10, step out 60m and set up reel & posts How much grass will I eat?
