



Soil sample before nutrients are applied

- Take advantage of good soil sampling conditions
- Take a sample every 2-4 Ha, walk in a 'W' pattern and keep away from drinking troughs, ditches and field entry/exits
- Ensure full cores are taken of 4" (10cm) to get an accurate analysis of pH,
 P & K

Using your slurry efficiently this Spring

- The prohibited period from spreading organic manures has passed for farms in Zone A & Zone B
- Spread at a rate of max. 2000 gal/acre of dilute cattle slurry. Adhere to buffer zones and weather warnings
- Target low soil index (1 & 2) paddocks
- The updated guide values for organic manures is about €25 per 1000 gallons so use wisely

Complete your AFC on PastureBase Ireland

- Walk your farm and complete your opening AFC on PBI
- Walking will help your identify areas suitable for nutrient application
- As you walk, review grazing infrastructure that need maintenance


