The importance of agriculture as an employer by County.



Above, on the left in grey, is a simple map of the counties of Ireland. Beside it are two cartograms based on the map and census employment data. A Cartogram is a way of showing geographic infomation that highlights a particular statistic that has a geographic basis. The cartogram process distorts the size and shape of geographic elements (counties in this case) realtive to the statistic we want to show. On the cartogram in the middle we highlight the realtive size of the farming employment as a fraction all people employed in the county- On the cartogram at the right, in pink we show the relative size of people employed in public admin as a fraction all people employed in the county.

Some clear features stand out - Dublin more or less disappears on the farming cartogram but doubles in size with realtive importance of public admin jobs in the county (the effect is as large in Louth). But for the ROI border counties we can see the huge importance of farming in Leitrim, Cavan and Monaghan as they are inflated to 3 or 4 times their real size.
