JOIN US IN LIMERICK FOR A FARM WALK WITH CIARAN BARTLEY

The first of this year's DairyBeef 500 farm walks takes place on the farm of Ciaran Bartley who operates a Dairy calf to beef system on 74 hectares Boher, Co. Limerick. The event will take place on Thursday the 29th of June at 6pm. The main focus of the event will demonstrate the improvements made on the farm in recent years and how this has had a positive effect on the financial performance of his enterprise.



On the day those in attendance will get a chance to see the grassland infrastructure improvements and how land drainage, the incorporation of a paddocks system has benefited the grassland management on the farm. Other topics that will be discussed on the day include changes to the herd's calf sourcing and the implementation of a herd health programme has improved animal health and subsequently animal performance on the farm. The farm is currently expanding with plans in place to construct new slatted housing to cater for the extra stock on the day the area of shed design and location as well as the grants available (Tams III) will be discussed.
