




SAFE FARM EIP PROJECT



New farmer driven health, safety and wellbeing training programme – 'Safe Farm'



Aims to stimulate and foster cultural and behavioural change at farm level



Using drama as an innovative approach



5 partners involved













SAFE FARM EIP PROJECT

Bottom-up, farmer-led approach

Needs Analysis

Survey (n=647 participants), Focus Group (n=3)

Training programme developed

Physical Farm Safety

Stress and Time Management

Vulnerable Groups

Farmer Wellbeing





SAFE FARM EIP PROJECT KEY FINDINGS TO DATE

- Almost half of farmers surveys (~48%) always or regularly feel they haven't enough time and are constantly chasing their tail
- Almost one fifth of farmers surveys (17%) always or regularly feel isolated and that nobody would understand what they're going through
- 14% of farmers surveyed have no one to confide in
- 86% believe a tailor-made support service should be made available to farmers experiencing mental health difficulties
- Almost half of farmers surveyed (43%) do not have a hobby that makes them leave the farm at least once a week
- 4% of farmers surveys appeared to be struggling without support





SAFE FARM EIP PROJECT OUTCOMES TO DATE



Dairygold have put in place a VHI helpline for farmers



A bespoke script developed based on the findings of needs analysis



Live training delivered to approx. 100 farmers


