




Well that's one of the things that we agree about around the table. None of us would be focusing on managing grass if we felt we weren't going to benefit financially from it.




And the first thing that, when I started to became aware of grassland management, in the back of my mind was, well, that's a huge extra cost. And I'm not in a situation where I can spend all that
