Milk summary: (milk yields are fluctuating from day to day impact on accuracy currently)

Demonstration farmer comment from Joe Carroll: My SCC was high for a while which was due to mastitis. It is sorted out now and my most recent SCC result was 130. Grazing is going well at the moment. I have 40% of the area grazed and 88% of the cows calved in 5 weeks. My target for the second round is April 10 and I should be on target for this.

Advisor comment from Robert Prendiville: Do not let the average farm cover drop below 600 kg DM per hectare. A lot of farms have more than half of the first round grazed at this stage. Monitor grass growth and allocate an area each day. The start date on most farms for the second round is April 10. Also SCC is high on some farms at present. Get a milk recording done as soon as possible to identify high SCC cows. It is also worth noting that cows calved greater than 60 days will not be included in the mastitis control during the dry period/ calving. For the most accurate information on your Cellcheck report, get the first milk recording done ASAP.
