Farmer comment from Niall Moloney:

- Finished grazing with two weeks as didn't want to damage ground, AFC was 610KgDM/Ha at the time
- Dried off 30 cows of which 12 were selective with SCC below 100 all year & below 60 in last test
- We are using milk sensitivity testing to decide on dry cow therapy where necessary
- Incalf Heifers weighed today average 475Kgs, vaccinated for Salmonella and tails clipped
- Dung sampling will be used to determine if dosing is required on the herd

## Adviser comment from Kevin Stagg:

- As weanling heifers are been housed group them according to weight if possible
- Weanlings that are behind target weight will need 2-3 kgs ration per day with good silage
- Feed extra ration in the first part of the winter. Ration can be reduced or stopped completely closer to turnout
- Most incalf heifers would benefit from getting 1-2 kg ration per day from now until the 1<sup>st</sup> January
- Continue to maintain good hygiene in the cubicle house. Clean down the cubicles and lime twice per day.
