## **Farmer comment from Kieran Murphy:**

- Cows being dried off with about 53% of the herd is now dried off, plan to finish about the 15<sup>th</sup> December
- Poorer quality silage is being fed to the cows due to dry off and for a few days after dry off
- We are monitoring for any mastitis in the cows that are dried off
- Finished grazing about the 10<sup>th</sup> November and silage stocks should be ok for the winter
- Scanned in August had 8.5% empty after 11weeks AI, these were sold in October

## Adviser comment from Denis Brassil:

- Many events were run recently for dry cow therapy, if not already done have a conversation with your Vet
- Given adverse weather of Autumn 23 a lot of silage was feed early complete a winter Fodder budget now
- If a silage deficit is found there are more options available the earlier you start
- December is a good month to review the Farms 2023 Financial performance to identify areas to control
- Record dry-off dates for cows this will help when reviewing Cow performance to identify better cows
