Demonstration farmer comment from Joe Carroll: The cover per cow on the farm is 172 kg DM. First cut silage was made on May 15th. It yielded 10 bales per acre. I oversowed clover in April and this ground has been grazed 3 times already. I am grazing low covers to give the clover every chance. I have to walk the farm very regularly to make sure the grass clover covers on the oversown paddocks don't get too strong before grazing. After three weeks of breeding I have a submission rate of 88%. Late calvers will be put on fixed time AI next week. I used sex semen on the heifers this year. I also recently purchased a 6.6 kilowatt solar panel. I hope that this will be going in over the summer.

Advisor comment from Eoin Horgan: Walk silage crops straight away, many crops have bulked over the past 2 weeks and are ready to cut. Aim to make good quality silage this year, so cut as soon as possible. DMD will reduce by 2-3% per week from now on. Delayed cutting will reduce 2nd cut yield. Make safety a priority during this silage season.
