Demonstration farmer comment from William Dennehy: Cows are in full time since last Sunday. Cows are on baled silage and 4 kgs of meal. I still have 10 to 14 grazings left for the cows to graze. I will hold off grazing it until the weather clears up. SCC is OK at the moment. I am milk recording again next week and once I have the results from that milk recording I am going to be looking at drying off the first calvers. I am doing a sensitivity test to assess what is needed. Calves are on silage plus 2 kgs of meal .The heifers will also be coming back from the contract rearer shortly.

Advisor comment Ger Courtney: you are moving into the phase of an indoor diet for feeding milking cows. There is a risk for a rapid loss of body condition for younger stock. Ensure you monitor body condition. Test the quality of the silage being given to cows. Ensure the energy and protein contents are OK; 73 DMD and a crude protein content of at least 13% to 15%. The dry off period should be at least 10 weeks for first calves and 8 weeks for cows. There is still some grazing to be done to reach the target closing cover. Take opportunities to do on/off grazing when conditions improve.
