Farmer Update: Michael Kavanagh

Michael has 10% of his 2nd rotation grazed today pre grazing yields are 1300 Kg's of Dm/ha. 80% of the milking platform has gotten 2 rounds of 2000 gallons of slurry per acre and 30 units of Pro urea. Cows are being followed in this rotation with 30 units of Pro Urea or 18-6-12 + S where hasn't gotten slurry with lower indices. Breeding is due to start next wednesday, maiden heifers and 9 cows are now on syncronisation program for sexed semen. In the three week pre breeding observation 40 cows were in heat in first 10 days and plenty of activity at the moment. 2nd milk recording ordered for today 70% of SCC in first milk recording was attributable to 3 cows 2 of these are repeat offenders so will be culled. Michael plans to top up the silage ground with 40 units of Pro urea today. Paddock identified for reseed is being grazed tonight and will be ploughed after spray off in next fortnight.

Advisor Update: Denis Brassil

Conditions continue to vary across the region, drier areas are drying out faster allowing fertiliser and slurry applications to happen. Heavier clay or mud areas are still very difficult ground conditions, hopefully the warmer forecast for next week will allow these to dry and allow catch up to happen on these areas of the farm with fertiliser and grazing. On drier farms with less grazing done it's getting very close to decision time on cutting out some paddocks for bales to correct grass quality on farm, these paddocks can also allow for slurry applications and will return to the grazing platform quickly helping to correct the feed wedge. Breeding season is just around the corner and where some cows are under conditioned after the difficult spring it can be helpful to place some of these on OAD milking to help improve their BCS, leave these with the main herd, milk in the morning and don't attach clusters in the evening to these cohort and return to TAD milking once breed.
