## **Farmer Update: Joe Carroll**

My normal grass walk was on Tuesday and i planned to start the second rotation next Monday, i walked the first grazed paddocks today and decided i need to move to the second rotation in the morning as next 4 paddocks are heading for 1300-1400 Kg's of Dm/Ha. I will bale off the remainder of the first rotation after next weeks rain. I plan to start breeding next week and will do a scan on all cows not breed at the end of the first week or observed in heat in the two weeks pre breeding. I have a few later calvers on once a day milking until they are breed to try and bring these forward in the calving season. Maiden heifers will be observed for the first week and anything not breed at that stage will be given a shot of Progesterone to bring them in, i have had good success with this for the last few years. Paddock identified for reseed is being grazed tonight and will be spray off in the regrowth, i have also identified a paddock for overseeding with white clover and i'm going to include some plaintain with this also 2kg's of each per acre.

## Advisor Update: Shane Randles Kanturk Office

Conditions have improved on all farms this week giving some farmers a chance to spread slurry and reduce the pressure on tanks. All farmers should have cows out after the good weather, where there is a lot of grass on farms cows should be out full time. Grass walks will be very important over the coming weeks to make sure grazed paddocks don't get too strong while farmers are still trying to graze the first rotation. In some circumstances some of the first rotation could be cut out for bales or added into the first cut silage. Farmers should continue to aim to cut silage towards the middle to end of May for quality silage. Where farmers aim to incorporate clover into swards these paddocks need to be selected and stitched over the next two weeks to try and give the clover the best chance to establish.
