- Operating since November 2015
- 19 farmers rearing 2,090 heifers
- Plans to rear 2,600 heifers in 2019
- Range 30-300 heifers per farm



Group Profile





- Cattle and sheep farmers
- Contract rear in conjunction with existing enterprise
- Sole enterprise in some cases
- Generally one owner one rearer



The Heifers





- Sourced from spring compact calving herds
- Reared from 3 weeks, 12 weeks9 months of age
- Summer Grazing
- Generally return to owner in late
 Oct at 20 months of age

The Dairy Farmer

- Responsibilities
 - Communication
 - Trust
 - Difficult to take the first step
 - Analyse his own rearing costs

- The use of the Rearer's
 - Land
 - Labour
 - Facilities
 - Variable costs
- WIN-WIN



The Rearer Kieran Henry





- Commenced farming in 2011
- Leased adjoining farm
- Establish a pedigree limousin suckler herd
- Contract rearing since 2016
- Increase stocking rate from 0.9 to 1.8 Lu/Ha
- Soil fertility
- Reseeding



Kieran Henry





- Paddock system
- 75 + DMD silage
- New animal housing 2018
- Scanning results 2018
 - 83% in calf to AI 3 weeks
 - 96% in calf at 6 weeks
 - 100% in calf at 12 weeks
- Gross Margin €743/Ha
- Target €1,200/Ha by 2020



Group Objectives






- To increase farm profitability
- By increasing farm stocking rate
- Increasing overall farm output
- Maximising grass production and utilisation
- Increasing number of grazing days
- Producing high quality silage
- Minimising labour
- Building long term relationships
- Achieving targets



The 5 stages of heifer rearing





Benefits as outlined by group members



- A means of increasing stocking rate without investing in stock
- Allows for clear direction in farm planning
- Good for cash flow
- Clear guidelines in contract agreement
- Long term relationships can be established



Benefits as outlined by group members



- Docile animals to work with
- Increase in farm profitability
- Gross margins for contract rearing enterprise range €743/Ha - €1,394/Ha in 2017
- Income to develop existing farm infrastructure and plan for future direction



Risks as outlined by group members



- Takes time to build trust
- Management prior to arrival
- Heifers arriving under target weights
- Heifers arriving in poor health status
- Initial contract



Risks as outlined by group members



- Technical efficiency
- Set up costs moving herd test
- Disease risk
- Herd health plan
- The Relationship



Making Contract Rearing work



- Detailed Contract Rearing Agreement
- Mutually agreed terms & conditions
- Talk to local DVO
- Annual visit to dairy farm
- Regular weighing of stock
- Avoid average figures
- Using ICBF link for breeding and weight recording

Making Contract Rearing work



- Heifers retained by owner for comparison
- Heat synchronisation at breeding
- Maximise residency period
- Independent Intermediary agreed on by both parties
- Discussion group knowledge in the collective
- Building Trust


