Attend one of our forest information meetings to see what the new Forestry Programme offers you. The new Afforestation Scheme 2023-2027 is now open for applications. With many new options and significantly increased payments, it's a good time to take a fresh look at what it offers. The main features of the new Afforestation Scheme are:

- 12 forest type options including a new Forests for Water option;
- afforestation grants for farm forests up to €8,555 per hectare;
- up to 20-year annual premiums for farmers*
 (NB: 10-year annual premium for agroforestry);
- premiums up to €1,142 per hectare per year; and,
- all grant and premium earnings are highly tax efficient.

*Payment of the farmer premium will be determined by meeting scheme eligibility criteria.

The Afforestation Scheme provides establishment grants and annual premiums to plant and establish

forests on suitable 'green field' sites. To plant a new forest a farmer must engage a registered forester to make their afforestation application. Afforestation grants usually cover the cost for site preparation, fencing, trees and tree planting. Forestry applicants will also receive an annual forestry premium. Farmers will receive annual premiums for up to 20 years and non-farmer applicants for up to 15 years. The rate of the afforestation grant and premium is determined by the particular forest type option planted.

Teagasc/DAFM information meetings

Teagasc, along with staff from the Forestry Division of the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM), is planning a nationwide series of in-person public information meetings on the new Afforestation Scheme. Attendees will hear about

the forest types that are now grant aided, what is involved in making an application and how forestry can integrate with other farm enterprises and schemes. All meetings commence at 7.30pm and details of each are shown in **Table 1**.

Teagasc forest photo competition 2023

Teagasc Forestry has announced this year's photo competition with the theme: Celebrating the New Forestry Programme 2023-2027. This tree-themed competition will focus on the multi-functional nature of forests, from timber production to biodiversity enhancement. The competition provides a great opportunity for budding (non-professional) photographers and photo enthusiasts to get snapping while being in with a chance to win exciting prizes.

The Celebrating the New Forestry Programme 2023-2027 competition focuses on three

consecutive forest themes running from October to December 2023. At the end of each theme period, the winner for that theme will be chosen and is guaranteed a prize of \in 400 in vouchers, with \in 100 in vouchers for each of two selected runners up.

Each theme winner will also go forward to a grand final on December 15, when the overall competition winner will be in line for a further €600 in vouchers. This year's competition features three themes: Trees and Biodiversity; Farming and Trees; and, The Forest Harvest (see **Table 2**).
