- 2 Hill groups engaged through Flockbook recording
- 240 Hill rams genotyped pre-2023
- Sales catalogues providing little information
- Very little ancestry information to buyers
- Scrapie genotypes an unknown on the Hill
- Inbreeding thought an issue with no facts





Genotyping & Irish Sheep


Irish ram breeders are currently getting

- Parentage verification (where parents have been genotyped too)
- Scrapie resistance level (scrapie genotype)
- Inbreeding coefficient (how inbred the animal is)
- Genomic genetic evaluation
- Visible and accurate breeding lines in catalogues.
- National database records for long term breeding strategies.

What have we learned

- Scrapie results painting a clearer picture
- Inbreeding creeping up with every generation

Genomics Scrapie (DAFM approved)

	Scrapie Type				
	1	2	3	4	5
Purebred Lowland animals	66.4%	28.1%	4.8%	0.5%	0.2%
Purebred Hill animals pre-2023	19.4%	44.8%	30.1%	2.0%	3.6%
Purebred Hill animals post-2023	18.7%	44.2%	28.0%	3.4%	4.2%

- Scrapie results are reported for each genotyped animal
- Purebred hill animals that have been genotyped to date have a significantly higher percentage of scrapie type three animals
- Type 4 & 5 scrapie is immerging slightly higher then anticipated
 - Type 1 = Most resistant to Scrapie
 - Type 5 = Least resistant to Scrapie




How will a flockbook help?

- Protection from breed dilution from other strains and inbreeding
- A foundation for systematic breed improvement
- A great platform to help promote the breed

Flockbook and performance Recording











- Aim is to find levels of heritability within this trait









Sheep Improvement Scheme What is the task?

- Every farmer **must purchase and use** a Sheep Ireland genomically tested sire in the first 3 years of the SIS
 - Flocks over 150 ewes must complete a second time by year 5
- That ram must be Scrapie Type 1/2/3
- Lowland Flocks: Ram must be 4/5 Star on the Replacement or Terminal Index
- Hill Flocks: Ram must be Sire verified (Blackface Mountain / Cheviot). Lowland option also available to hill flocks








What's coming in 2024?


- Demand for SIS eligible hill rams to increase in 2024.
- More genotyped rams needed to meet this demand.



SIS Hill Ram Demand










Numbers of hill rams genotyped

Genotyped numbers not everything		
	Example	
2022 born Hill rams Genotyped in 2023	• 1,889	
(7.9%) failed due to being scrapie 4 or 5	• - 150	
(32.4%) failed due to no sire genotyped	• - 611	
(61.7%) qualify for SIS	• 1,166	







What can an SIS ram do for commercial farmers

- Assured parentage through DNA verification
- Decrease your chances of Inbreeding
- Secure a healthy scrapie status in your flock
- Rams DNA is stored on national database that can lead to genetic linkage with research and future hill index development
